

"The Church Is Committed to Restoring Those Living in Sin" (Galatians 6:1-3)

INTRODUCTION

- 4 Primary Passages Dealing with Church Discipline: Matthew 18:15-20; Titus 3:10-11; I Corinthians 5; Galatians 6:1-3
- KEY POINT: No one's ongoing sin should be overlooked.

EXPOSITION

- The goal in our rebuke is restoration.
- 4 Stages from Matthew 18:15-17
 - a) Go to him/her individually (vs. 15).
 - b) Take multiple witnesses (vs. 16).
 - c) Tell it to the church (vs. 17a).
 - d) Remove the unrepentant from the church (vs. 17b).
- Objections to Church Discipline and Some Answers
 - a) "We aren't supposed to be judgmental."

 ANSWER Our speech and our behavior reflect our heart (Matthew 12:34).
 - b) "This will hurt our church's reputation."

 ANSWER If done unbiblically, it might. But avoiding it questions the Gospel's power to deliver us from sin.
 - c) "Isn't excommunication a means of abandoning the sinner?"

 ANSWER If someone wants to change, we should not turn him away. But excommunication is giving the sinner what he wants, and it's not Jesus.

- d) "If he is removed from church, how will he ever hear the truth?"

 ANSWER God won't turn away anyone who seeks after Him (John 6:37). God is sovereign.
- The law of Christ is the law of love (Romans 13:8-10; Galatians 5:14; James 2:8).
- God disciplines those He loves (Hebrews 12:5-11).
- Before You Rebuke...
 - a) Check your *life* to make sure you don't have unconfessed sin.
 - b) Check your *heart* to make sure your motivations are pure, and your desire is to see him restored.
 - c) Check your words to make sure you lace them with love and grace.
 - d) Check your *goal* to make sure you want to help him repent and be reconciled to God and others.
- Cf. I Corinthians 10:12
