EXPOSITION – How Can We Be Sure That We Know Jesus as Lord and Savior?

- A. By Loving Jesus ______ (vs. 16-26)
 - 1. "What good things must I do?" (vs. 16-17)
 - This man was a rich (vs. 22), young, (vs. 20) ruler (Luke 18:18) probably from the Sanhedrin.
 - We cannot do enough good deeds to merit salvation (Matthew 5:48).
 - 2. "Which commandments?" (vs. 18-19)
 - Obedience doesn't save; obedience proves salvation. Eternal life depends on Jesus; Jesus' obedience on our behalf (II Corinthians 5:21).
 - 3. "What do I lack?" (vs. 20-22)
 - Contrast the response of the rich, young ruler to Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-9).

- 4. "Who can be saved?" (vs. 23-26)
 - Jesus is not saying that the wealthy cannot be saved (e.g., Job, David, Solomon, Abraham).
 - Jesus is not saying that money is bad (I Timothy 6:10).
 - We should not put our identity in our riches (I Timothy 6:17-19).
- B. By Loving Jesus _____ (vs. 27-29)
 - The disciples had done this (Philippians 3:8).
