NOTES ON PARABLES

- What is a parable? Means "to place beside" or "to cast alongside." When we place one thing alongside another, and a comparison is made between the two.
- How should a parable be interpreted?
 - 1) Read from the original audience's perspective.
 - 2) Look for the main point.
 - 3) Look at the context for the right interpretation.
 - 4) Don't build doctrine from parables.
- What is appealing about parables? Parables are true to life and resonate with the listener. Parables stir up our affections and hold our attention.
