 - ¹ Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have grasped, to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings, to open doors before him that gates may not be closed:"
 (Isaiah 44:28-45:1)






I. A question about taxes is **ASKED** (vs. 15-17).



- From the Hasidim who led revolts against Antiochus Epiphanes
- The word "Pharisee" means "separated one"
- They knew God's Law almost word-perfect

 They were the "religious" of the religious leaders



Pharisees



 Strict supporters of Herod the Great that often conspired against Jesus (Matthew 21:15; Mark 3:6; 12:13)

 Not a religious group like the Pharisees, but more political like the Sadducees

Herodians

 Supported the Roman Empire For man does not know his time. Like fish that are taken in an evil net, and like birds that are caught in a snare, so the children of man are snared at an evil time, when it suddenly falls upon them.

Ecclesiastes 9:12



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
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"Thus if Christ had legitimatized the payment of taxes, He would have seemed to abandon Israel's hope; but if He had denied Rome the right to collect taxes, He would have been guilty of treason."



The Words and Works of Jesus Christ

- This was a poll tax. Sometimes called the head tax.
- A tax based on a yearly census that was taken in the land. It would usually go up every year and the Romans claimed their taxes for infrastructure, roads, military protection, use of aqueducts, etc.
- Example issued right after Jesus was born that led Joseph and Mary to flee to Egypt (Luke 2:1-5)

Does the Government Have the Right to Collect Taxes?



Jesus never raised that issue.

 Taxes were used to fund the Roman military (e.g., the crucifixion, persecution in the Colosseum).
