

## The Fifth Commandment: Honor


EXODUS 20:12

DIVIDING THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

- 1. Real <u>relationships</u> start in the home.
- 2. Family relationships mirror our relationship to God (Ephesians 5:22, 25; 6:1).
- Parents must live a life worthy of honor (Colossians 3:21).
- 4. It is within our nature to hate authority.

- 5. We tend to de-value those <u>older</u> than us.
- 6. God sets up a <u>structure</u> of authority in the home (Deuteronomy 4:9-10, 40; 6:4-9).
- 7. God loves children.
- 8. The <u>family</u> was the first institution set up by God.

### EIGHT REASONS FOR THIS COMMANDMENT

Honor Your Parents (Exodus 20:12a)

#### THE COMMAND

- From the Hebrew word meaning "heavy" or "weighty"
- Means giving due weight to someone or someone's position
- The most common word (Hebrew: havad) for honor in the O.T.
- Honoring parents is honoring Christ (Colossians 3:20)

#### "HONOR"

By obeying them

Hear, my son, your father's instruction, and forsake not your mother's teaching, for they are a graceful garland for your head and pendants for your neck.

#### PROVERBS 1:8-9


Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land."

#### EPHESIANS 6:1-3

Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord.

#### COLOSSIANS 3:20

"When Scripture discusses the role of children in the family, the stress is on responsibilities, not rights. And every child's main responsibility is to obey his or her parents."




#### III JOHN 4
