Seven Lies About Suicide

- 1. Suicide is only caused by depression.
- 2. People who talk or think about suicide will do it.
- 3. Christians don't commit suicide.
- 4. Once suicidal, always suicidal.
- 5. Suicide can be in your DNA.
- 6. Suicide is someone else's fault.
- 7. The Bible doesn't address suicide.

Seven Foundations for a Conversation

- 1. Man is made in the image of God (Genesis 1:26-27).
- 2. Our bodies are not our own (I Corinthians 6:19-20).
- 3. God's Word answers life's difficult questions (Psalm 119:105; 121:1-2; Hebrews 4:12).
- A relationship with God generates hope (Psalm 42:11; 62:5-8; Romans 5:2-5).
- 5. Murder is sin (Exodus 20:13).
- 6. Jesus paid the penalty for sin and can forgive all sin (Isaiah 43:25; Micah 7:18-19; I John 1:9).
- 7. God gives strength and spiritual resources for every situation.

Three Lessons from the Suicides in the Bible

1. No redeemed person committed suicide in the Bible.

Can a Christian Commit Suicide? "Yes, but..."

- A problem with suicide: death becomes the only solution to hopelessness. We do not grieve without hope (I Thessalonians 4:13).
- Once a suicide happens, there is no chance for repentance.
- But we are only condemned for our rejection of Christ.

Can a Christian Commit Suicide? "Yes, but..."

- Salvation is not dependent on confession of every sin.
- Not every suicide is about hopelessness.

Romans 8:38-39

³⁸ For I am sure that neither death [like the death of suicide] nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.





How to Build a Framework of Hope

- God has a purpose and plan for your life (Isaiah 43:7; Il Corinthians 4:17).
- God's plan is for life. Death and destruction are Satan's desires (John 10:10).
- God promises our souls rest from our problems (Matthew 11:28-29).
- The Gospel saves us from being in bondage to sinful thinking (II Corinthians 5:17).

Others Exist to Comfort Us (II Corinthians 1:3-4).




