
"Pilate's People Pleasing"

MATTHEW 27:15-26



- In each of the four Gospels: Matthew 27:15-26; Mark 15:6-15; Luke 23:16-25; John 18:39-40)
- Name "bar" meaning "son of" and "rabbas" is a derivative of "rabbi." His name simply means "son of the rabbi" or "son of the father." Some suggest his name was Jesus.
- A notorious prisoner, murderous, rebellious, thief (Mark 15:7)
