Recent Statistics on Suicide

- The 10th leading cause of death in the U.S.
- In 2019, almost 50,000 people committed suicide and 1.4 million attempts
- Every day, 130 people take their own life
- The leading cause of death among teenagers?

Recent Statistics on Suicide

- Only 41% of pastors feel well-equipped in suicide prevention
- 1 out of 3 people in the church have a family member or friend take their own life

Church History and Suicide

- **Early church** mainly practiced by the wealthy; viewed as sinful, based on 6th Commandment
- Funeral services not held for suicides
- Augustine (354-430) no justification for it (The City of God)
- Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) a sin because it violated natural law, moral law, and God's divine law (Summa Theologica)

Church History and Suicide

- Reformation Luther called it a work of the devil
- **Puritans** (16th century) said it was submitting to the devil's desires
- **1800s** An understanding of mental illness led to the church becoming more compassionate
- 1900s Funerals for suicides began

Seven Lies About Suicide

- 1. Suicide is only caused by <u>depression</u>.
- 2. People who talk or think about suicide will do it.
- 3. Christians don't commit suicide.
- 4. Once suicidal, <u>always</u> suicidal.
- 5. Suicide can be in your <u>DNA</u>.
- 6. Suicide is someone else's fault.
- 7. The Bible doesn't address suicide.

The Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Prevention

<u>Suicide</u>: death from injury, poisoning or suffocation where there is evidence (either explicit or implicit) that the injury was self-inflicted and that the decedent intended to kill himself or herself
