A Simple Timeline of Salvation

- 1. God sends a preacher to preach the message of salvation.
- 2. The preacher preaches or shares the message of salvation.
- 3. People listen and hear God's message of salvation being preached.
- 4. People want to worship God almost immediately.
- 5. God saves those who genuinely repent from eternal destruction.
