What is Grace?

What is Mercy? What is Grace?

 Mercy is giving someone something they need.

 Grace is giving someone something they don't deserve.

• Grace comes from <u>God</u>.

• Grace is not merited.

• Grace is a gift.

 Grace's giver (God) is the object of our boasting. "Love that goes upward is worship; love that goes outward is affection; love that stoops is grace."

Are There Categories of Grace?

Common (or general) Grace

"the form of grace enjoyed by all of humanity, whether they are saved or not"

"the grace of God which he gives people innumerable blessings that are not part of salvation"

Examples of Common Grace

- Life
- sun rising and sun setting (Matt 5:44)
- rain (Matt 5:45)
- food (Ps 145)
- intelligence (John 1:9)
- knowledge of God (Rom 1:21)
- knowing right from wrong (Rom 2:14-15)
- warnings of judgment
- any activity you enjoy on earth
- human government (Rom 13:1)

Why is God Gracious to Those Who Hate Him?

• Common grace can lead people to salvation (II Pet 3:9-10).

Common grace highlights God's mercy.

Are There Categories of Grace?

Common (or general) Grace

Special (or saving) Grace

"the form of grace where God removes the power and penalty of sin through Christ's work and sanctifies us through the Holy Spirit"

"God seems to choose those who have been the greatest sinners in order to show them His greatest grace."

Why Do We Need Grace?

Why Do We Need God's Grace?

1. Because we think too <u>highly</u> of ourselves

2. To balance out God's judgment

3. We are not gracious enough.

Is Grace Enough?

 Background for Jonah
9th smallest book in the Bible; only 48 verses

 The missionary book of the O.T.; example of what kind of missionary NOT to be

 Narrative about a minor prophet and not prophecies about future events

7 Miracles in Jonah

1. storm (1:4)

- 2. selection of Jonah by lot (1:7)
- 3. sudden subsiding of the sea (1:15)
- 4. fish appearing at right time (1:17)
- 5. preservation of Jonah in the fish (1:17)
- 6. ejection from the fish (2:10)
- 7. plant miraculously growing (4:6)

How Do We Know Jonah is Literal? 1. Jesus refers to it in Matthew 12:39-41.

2. Il Kings 14:25 references Jonah as a prophet.

3. Not questioned until 19th century

4. Parables don't usually contain these many details.

Who Was Jonah?

 From Gath Hepher in Zebulun, north of Nazareth

• A prophet before Jeroboam II (793-753 B.C.), during Assyrian power

Succeeded Elisha

A type of Christ

Some Truths to Consider 1. We can learn how to respond to the <u>sovereign</u> decisions of God.

2. God's grace restores us through confession and repentance.

3. God can use you despite your inadequacies, weaknesses, faults, inabilities, and sins.
