KEY POINT: When in doubt, focus on the <u>Who</u> and not just the <u>Why</u>.

I. Because His truth is <u>clear</u> (vs. 2)

"All things in Scripture are not alike plain in themselves, nor alike clear unto all; yet those things which are necessary to be known, believed, and observed for salvation, are so clearly propounded, and opened in some place of Scripture or other, that not only the learned, but the unlearned, in a due use of the ordinary means, may attain unto a sufficient understanding of them."

Westminster Confession of Faith 1.7

- 1. Not everything in Scripture is as clear as everything else.
- 2. We can always find a clearer passage to teach a confusing truth in another passage.
- 3. The Gospel will be clear.
- Even if we don't understand everything, we can understand enough for life and godliness (II Peter 1:3).

What We Learn from this Definition of Clarity

¹¹ For this commandment that I command you today is not too hard for you, neither is it far off. ¹² It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will ascend to heaven for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?' ¹³ Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will go over the sea for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?'¹⁴ But the word is very near you. It is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can do it.
