 Failed to drive the Canaanites out of their inherited territory (Judges 1:29) and failed to remember the works of God

• Deserted other tribes in war

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 - d) Contrast #4 <u>God's Judgment</u> and <u>Israel's Infidelity</u> (vs. 56-72)


• We anger God (vs. 21, 31, 38, 50, 58-62).
