Psalms Read in the Temple After the Exile

- Monday – Psalm 48 (a psalm about the city of Zion)
- Tuesday – Psalm 82 (a psalm exhorting the people to care for the needy)
- Wednesday – Psalm 94 (a psalm of God's unwillingness to forget His promise)
- Thursday – Psalm 81 (a psalm calling for God's people to listen to Him)





Psalms Read in the Temple After the Exile

- Friday – Psalm 93 (a psalm speaking of God's rule and reign in the universe)
- Saturday – Psalm 92 (a psalm of God's work in creation)
- Sunday – Psalm 24
