

We have a new heart - Ezekiel 36:26-27.


Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.


We are a new humanity - Ephesians 2:14-16.

Why Was the Old Self Crucified?

- 1. So sin may be brought to nothing
 - · Before The Fall (in the Garden of Eden) posse peccare "able to sin"
 - · After The Fall non posse no peccare "not able to not sin"
 - · After Salvation posse non peccare "able not to sin"
 - · In Heaven non posse peccare "not able to sin"

2. So we would no longer be enslaved to sin
