





2 Historical Schools of Thought: Literal Method

- or historical, grammatical, and literary methods
- Focuses on the plain sense of words

2 Historical Schools of Thought: Allegorical Method

- follows a hidden or secret meaning which is remote from or unrelated to any obvious meaning
- Developed and introduced by Augustine
- Can be subjective



- Examples Deuteronomy 6:7; Psalm 19:7








