"We did not choose to be made physically alive and we did not choose to be born—it is something that happened to us; similarly, these analogies in Scripture suggest that we are entirely passive in regeneration."



Wayne Grudem Systematic Theology ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!

"The final verb, "being seated," refers to believers' present exaltation, specifically the privileges, honor, and authority they share as a result of their union with the exalted Christ."

⁸ He will punish those who do not know God and do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. ⁹ They will be punished with everlasting destruction and shut out from the presence of the Lord and from the majesty of his power.

Saving faith is *trust* in Jesus Christ as a living person for forgiveness of sins and for eternal life with God.

2. Not from <u>yourselves</u>—it is the <u>gift</u> of God

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

⁹ who has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time,

⁵ he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit,

⁸ "I am the Lord; that is my name! I will not give my glory to another or my praise to idols. ⁷ everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made."

¹¹ For my own sake, for my own sake, I do this. How can I let myself be defamed? I will not yield my glory to another.

30 But by His doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption, 31 that, just as it is written, "Let him who boasts, boast in the Lord."
